2015 Fall School in Humanitarian Action (HA)

Humanitarian Action today has to take into account political, cultural, legal and health dimensions. For the seventh time the NOHA (Network on Humanitarian Action) Fall School will be conducted by university staff and field actors in order to provide professionals with a global approach and specific tools.

Objective

The Fall School aims at training professionals dealing with projects in HA in order to give them a critical overview of HA in a multidisciplinary perspective and the relevant information for evaluation of projects. New challenges in HA will also be examined.

Target audience

Civil servants, staff from local, international and civil society organizations, and more generally those who are involved in HA and feel the need to upgrade their basic knowledge and skills.

NOHA is an **International Association of Universities** that aims to enhance professionalism in the Humanitarian sector by promoting humanitarian values through higher education accredited courses, and by fostering a humanitarian research ethos that encourages innovation in humanitarian policy and practice. NOHA full members are **Aix-Marseille Université, Universidad de Deusto, Ruhr-Universität Bochum, University College Dublin, Rijksuniversiteit Groningen, Université catholique de Louvain, Uppsala Universitet, Warsaw University, Vilnius University, University of Copenhagen, University of Malta, and University of Pavia**. Since it was created in 1993, more than 3,000 graduates have followed the Joint Master in International Humanitarian Action. NOHA counts on the cooperation and support of the EU through the DG Humanitarian Aid & Civil Protection (ECHO) and the DG for Education and Culture. The initiative was a response to a growing need for higher educational qualifications specifically suited to addressing complex humanitarian emergencies. In 2005, NOHA was awarded by the European Commission **Erasmus Mundus Partnerships Programme** in order to establish and develop a framework for cooperation and student and scholar mobility between NOHA and 8 partner universities worldwide. More than two decades of experience has proved the NOHA commitment and capacity to educate and train highly committed, **inter-disciplinary** persons who can act at all levels of humanitarian relief operations and who can function in a variety of ways to enhance the delivery of humanitarian assistance and sustainable actions.
