



2017 NOHA Winter School in the Humanitarian-Development Nexus Pavia – Italy

The second edition of the NOHA Winter School offers a practice-oriented approach to the main key issues, challenges and professional implications concerning the Humanitarian-Development Nexus. The relevance of creating and fostering the nexus has been firmly stated by the European Commission in the 2011 Agenda for Change and by the 2016 World Humanitarian Summit. Nevertheless, a number of unresolved issues are still to be tackled, both on a theoretical and operational perspective.

The Winter School is structured as a five-day course including frontal lessons with the presentation of theory and case studies, free discussion, group works, brainstorm sessions, video presentations. Furthermore, participatory techniques will be adopted to encourage dialogue and attendees' active involvement.

The course faculty includes leading experts from around the humanitarian world (both Non-Governmental and International Organisations), presenting conceptual and practical insights, thus offering participants first-hand experience drawn from major humanitarian emergencies. The Winter School is organized by the University of Pavia, member of the NOHA Network and CISP (International Committee for the Development of Peoples), with the financial support of DG ECHO.

A. How to reach Pavia

1) MILANO LINATE AIRPORT - PAVIA

Linate airport is 7 km far from the centre of Milan and 55 km from Pavia. It is the closest airport. Info: http://www.milanolinate-airport.com. For reaching Pavia from Linate Airport, several options are available:

1.1. Direct bus Linate-Pavia

There is a daily bus service from Linate Airport to Pavia railway station. The departures are at 8.40 a.m. (from Monday to Saturday) 9 a.m. (only on Sunday), 9.40 a.m. (from Monday to Saturday) 11.20 a.m., 1.10 p.m. 2.40 p.m., 4.55 p.m., 6.30 p.m. and 9.15 p.m. The bus timetable is subject to change. Before leaving double check the timetable on the website http://www.migliavaccabus.it/. A single ticket costs around 15,00 € and it takes one hour to get to Pavia.

1.2. From Linate to Pavia, passing through Milano Stazione Centrale

There is a regular bus service from Linate airport to Milano Stazione Centrale (railway station). If you arrive at Linate, get out from the airport (ground floor) and look for a "Starfly" bus going to Milano Stazione Centrale. The bus leaves every 30 minutes from 6.05 to 23.45 and costs about 4 €. Once at the train station, you can easily take a direct train from Milano Stazione Centrale to Pavia. Check the train timetable in advance to avoid surprises. Depending on the type of train selected, the ticket may cost between 4.00 € and 9.50 €. Regional trains "Regionali" are the cheapest ones. For more information and checking timetable, visit: www.trenitalia.com.

Alternatively, you could also take an ATM bus N. 73 that runs every 20 minutes, for reaching the train station. The journey lasts about 25 minutes and it costs 1.50 €. The bus stops at piazza S. Babila and you can take the metro to Stazione Centrale from there.

2) MALPENSA INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT - PAVIA

Malpensa International airport lies at about 50 km from the centre of Milan. There are two different terminals linked by a free shuttle bus, available every 7 minutes about for twenty-four hours a day. Info: www.milanomalpensa-airport.com/it. For reaching Pavia from Malpensa Airport several options are available:

2.1. From Malpensa to Pavia, passing through Milano Stazione Centrale

Take a shuttle bus to Milano Stazione Centrale (central railway station) from outside the airport terminals 1 and 2. The bus runs every 20 minutes and costs about 10 €. It takes 50 minutes to get to Milano Centrale. Check timetable at http://www.malpensashuttle.it/e-index2.php.

Once at the train station, you can easily take a direct train from Milano Stazione Centrale to Pavia. Check the train timetable in advance to avoid surprises. Depending on the type of train selected, the ticket may cost between 4.00 € and 9.50 €. Regional trains "Regionali" are the cheapest ones. 2.2. From Malpensa to Pavia, passing through Milano Bovisa train station

Get the train from Malpensa airport to Milano Bovisa railway station (around 13 €). From Milano Bovisa there is a direct train to Pavia (around 4 €). Check timetable at www.trenitalia.com and http://www.malpensaexpress.it/en/







3) ORIO AL SERIO INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

Orio al Serio Airport is situated in the heart of Northern Italy and can be easily reached from all over Lombardy. It is the main low cost companies' airport. Orio al Serio is 45 km from Milan and 88 km from Pavia. Info: www.orioaeroporto.it/.

For reaching Pavia from Orio al Serio airport, take a shuttle bus to Milano Stazione Centrale (central railway station) from outside the airport. The bus runs every 30 minutes and costs about 5€. It takes 1 hour to get to Milan. Check timetable at http://www.orioshuttle.com/eng/ Once at the station, you can easily take a direct train from Milano Stazione Centrale to Pavia. Check the train timetable in advance to avoid surprises. Depending on the type of train selected, the ticket may cost between 4 € and 9.50 €. Regional trains "Regionali" are the cheapest ones.

B. Housing in Pavia
